
Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Architectural Monument of Tacoma

The Deacon's Bench

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With Christmas being only a week away, our anticipation for the coming of the Lord Jesus is high—Son of the Divine Father taking on human flesh. The relationship between God the Father and Son (Jesus) is a supernatural one and is not the same as the relationship between human parents and their children. Human fathers are not fathers before their children are born. If you were an only child could your dad ever have been called father before you were born? No, not until a son or daughter is born can a man be a father.

So if we think in human terms we may consider that God the Father did not exist before the Son was born. However the Church states that God the Father has *always* been the Father. So if the Father has always been the Father then the Son (Jesus) has *always* been too. Jesus is the eternal Son of the eternal Father. The Father did not exist without the Son for even one moment because the Father was always Father and the Son was always Son. To reiterate: unlike our human condition, God the Father does not exist before the Son, both exist at the same time. Wow, what a statement about the mystery of God!



The two words (father and son) depend on each other, and the two persons of God have always existed simultaneously together. The Church teaches that God does not exist in time or space as we know it, so we don't need to worry that the Father did not exist before the Son. The Catholic Church regards Jesus as the eternal Son of the Father and teaches that the relationship between them is one of profound everlasting and dynamic love. This relationship between Father and Son is so intense and perfect it led St. Thomas Aquinas to say that the third person of the Trinity (the Holy Spirit) is the living personified fruit their mutual love.

So as we approach Christmas let us keep in our hearts the mysterious union of Father and Son and give thanks to Jesus for humbling himself out of great love to come and redeem us.
